WELCOME LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



The founding of this nonprofit is a passion project that is close to my heart. Let me tell you a little about how we got here...

Early in my career, I discovered my love for teaching students who were not flourishing in the traditional learning systems. I witnessed firsthand the challenges that students faced, so I founded WorldWide Tutoring to help students of all ages and all abilities with all subjects. I trained my tutors in my proven effective methodologies to deliberately intertwine into their instruction lessons on the underlying learning and life skills that are vital to their students' success in the classroom and beyond. For the past 11 years, I've witnessed amazing success among WWT's students.

When I saw that recent school closures and changes in education were disproportionately negatively affecting low-income students of color, I decided to establish the nonprofit Educate. Radiate. Elevate. in November 2020. The goal of this 501(c)(3) is to help close the widening achievement gap by providing high-quality, personalized instruction to underserved K-12 students — at no cost to their families. E.R.E's mission is to strengthen the educational achievement of our most vulnerable youth in order to provide economic, social, and mental stability for them, their families, communities, and future generations.

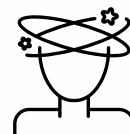
